Refusal to ride an ambulance A student attending a Physics and Astronomy course was found in a corridor suffering a seizure. The instructor contacted 911, and Security Services. The student refused to ride the ambulance to the Hospital due to the cost associated with the transport after been provided first care. The instructor contacted the LASH Committee requesting a proper procedure to follow in similar circumstances. During the Safety Training of New Instructors by the Faculty, the issue is discussed. October 18, 2022	Building Evacuation Fire alarms went off in Duff Roblin Bldg. caused by smoke coming out of the incinerator. Following the incident, the building was evacuated for several hours. Note: some individuals were re-entering the bldg. once the alarm was shut off, prior the clearance to reoccupy the building by the Fire Department. The Biological Sciences Head of the Department emailed occupants that the Fire Department deemed safe to enter the bldg. He recommended to minimize the time spent in the building due to smoke as the HVAC system clears the air. Some workers reported dizziness, and trouble breathing after half an hour of been in the bldg. The LASH Committee was questioning if the air quality had been tested by Physical Plant. Note: the LASH has recommended to post signs on the tunnels and outside doors to prevent re-entering the building before deem safe by the Fire Department.
